Application/Referral Timeline

- **Step 1:** Submit your online referral form at http://katz.az1.qualtrics.com/SE/?SID=SV_4IN7sx10LbCdPn and in the "Comments about Candidate" box, select your chapter's name or PBAN. A Katz Admissions Officer will contact you once in receipt of this completed form.
- **Step 2:** Create an account and submit your application at https://app.applyyourself.com/AYApplicantLogin/fl_ApplicantConnectLogin.asp?id=up-katz
- **Step 3:** Contact one of the Katz Recruiters to request:
 - Waiver of Katz application fee (\$50)
 - Waiver of GMAT registration fee (\$250) or GRE registration fee (\$195)
